

And Now a Little Tech Tip from Anthony

(not to be confused with a Tech Tip from Little Anthony)


Last year I was in Yuba City rewiring my friend Doug Hadley's 54 Commander when I ran into a small obstacle. See, his car had already been upgraded to 12 volt negative ground and uses a positive wire to excite the starter solenoid. However, the original toggle that controlled it would use the ground to send the power to the solenoid.

So the question became, how do I make grounded switch send positive voltage? The answer? A relay! The system is actually pretty simple, easy to hook up, And lets you keep your stock switches. I didn't

а

even have to cut the new harness if I made adapters.

So it goes like this; I wired the relay so that the 12v DC input and the trigger terminals had a hot wire coming off the ignition circuit (I piggybacked off the fuse panel), then I ran the ground terminal wire to the car's original start switch. The wire that originally connected to the start switch now gets connected to the relay. This means that the



relay only sends power to the solenoid when the switch grounds the relay. After that I just mounted the relay under the dash.

Now to be honest, his ignition switch was previously changed to a Chrysler style which had the "start" function so really I didn't need to do any of this, but I just couldn't stand the original start toggle not having a function. I hope this works out for someone and that they find it handy. I was sure pleased with it.
