An Ohio Memory

Life sometimes has unexpected opportunities! Recently we went to Ohio for a genealogy association meeting. While there we went to two small towns for family research. In Millersberg, a small town with beautiful hanging flower baskets on light posts, we were able to visit the courthouse and see actual family marriage records. While walking out of the courthouse, we noticed a banner announcing a car show on Main Street that night. We were interested! We were able to see a small town come alive with wonderful people and cars. The official car show opening was a 7 o'clock, but cars started coming to town about 3 o'clock to claim prime parking spaces.



This Amish "T" is built with the body being an actual Amish buggy. This area in Ohio has a very large Amish population and seeing Amish buggies on roads is a common sight. One public library we went to actually had a special parking barn for Amish patrons to park their horses and buggies.



This little red car is actually a very rare 1955 Willys Aero Custom. Willys Jeep produced the Aero from 1952 to 1955, in Toledo, Ohio. In 1955, 2 models were standard: "Custom 4 door" and "Bermuda 2 door." This car was a special order "2 door Custom" of which only 200 were produced and only in 1955. According to the owner, there are only 4 known to exist.



A show stopper was a 1991 Nissan Figaro. This car was built and sold in Japan for only one year. Only 20,000 of these cars were built. It was designed to compete with Italian designer cars. It featured right-hand drive, a retractable roof, 12 inch wheels, and a 1 liter 4 cylinder turbo engine that gets about 36 mpg. This car was bought in Japan and taken to England for detailing. The current owner purchased it and reported he had no problems bringing it to Ohio, but stated he would never think of trying to bring it to "restrictive California." This car is totally original and has about 45,000 miles.



This custom "Little Pete" semi truck cart was an instant hit with children. It actually was used as a golf cart.



At a distance, this vehicle looks like a very nicely converted Cadillac. However, it was very interesting to find this vehicle is actually a very rare Cadillac Mirage Sports Wagon. According to the owner, this is one of 104 custom built Cadillacs built in Los Angeles, California. Built in 1976, it was sold through Cadillac dealers and the Neiman-Macus Father's Day catalog for \$27, 300. A fully equipped Cadillac could be purchased for \$11,600. The rich and famous who purchased one of these custom vehicles included Liberace, Peter Lorie, Evil Knievel, and Red Adair. (If you know these people you are over 39.) This vehicle had a very very very long list of custom features.



This charming 2 door Lark came with a story. The Lark was shown by a woman who shared such a wonderful story of her father owning and enjoying this vehicle so much. When his health began to decline, he decided to give it to her. However, her father wanted to make sure she knew how to drive the car so he gave her a driving lesson. Her memories are so tender of her dad and her special gift from him. She actually drives her Lark to work about once a week, weather permitting. (The woman is not currently a member of the Studebaker Drivers' Club but wants to go to South Bend. We gave her encouragement to join SDC and what to see in South Bend.)




